PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we head into the summer of 2021 there are many things to look forward to as we transition from lockdowns to normal. For me there is nothing better than the return of concerts. My first "real" concert was a memorable one. A bunch of friends and I, all children of members of Hillcrest, went to Shea Stadium to see The Rolling Stones on their Steel Wheels tour. The reason I am telling you this is not only to shout out to my friends (Jon, Ben, Steven, Charles and Russell) but because of one of the lyrics I am sure Mick Jagger sang that night. "You can't always get what you want, but if you try sometimes, well you just might find you get what you need."

Concerts to me fulfill that basic purpose. I can't always get what I want (really good seats, the concert t-shirt, backstage passes) but they do provide what I need. Music, especially live music, is a place to decompress, a place to not think about the issues at Hillcrest or at work. It's just a place to be. To paraphrase an old bumper sticker, the worst concert is better than the best day of work.

Believe it or not, I find board meetings at Hillcrest relatively relaxing, as well as swimming in the pool, or just seeing friends at a Friday night dinner. Some people run color war for camp to decompress. The point is there is no right way to decompress, but there is a right place to do it.

Hillcrest might not always give you what you want, but it can always give you what you need. There is, as always, a catch. You have to be there. You have to show up and tell us what you need. Do you need a place for spiritual communication? Talk to us and let us figure out together how to best achieve that for you. Do you need a place to

crochet? What about a place to dance or a place to exercise? Hillcrest has that. What about something Hillcrest doesn't have? Well in that case let us refer to "Field of Dreams" where the quote is "If you build it, they will come." Tell us what you want! Do you need a place to play mah-jongg or bridge? A place to discuss current events? Hillcrest can be that place. We are on the edge of an unprecedented time. Our building has been shut for over a year, except for services. We do not have to reopen the way we were. We can change programs. We can open up space for new program ideas. We want to help you find what you need to become fulfilled. The really great thing? If we can reimagine Hillcrest, then with your help we can fulfill both parts of Mick's lyric. We can give you what you need, but if you tell us what you want, we can try to fulfill that as well.

The Gesher Program @ Ohr Chadash is specifically designed for the oldest and post bar/bat mitzvah students in our religious school. The group will spend Sunday mornings studying, discussing and experiencing different Jewish values and practices together with their teacher using print and electronic sources. They will also have a special opportunity to meet with the Rabbis of the three partner synagogues that support Ohr Chadash to explore relevant, current discussion topics. Our goal is to provide an engaging and age appropriate curriculum.

Some of the areas this group will examine on Sunday mornings are:

- ◆ Hebrew language module: Vocabulary, writing, grammar and speaking
- ◆ Davening (Prayer): Developing skills to be able to follow and potentially lead the service
- ◆ Tanach (Bible): Learning about the lesser known stories of the Bible and the nuances of the Torah that relate to the human condition and family dynamics
- ◆ Modern Israel: The politics and social climate in the Jewish homeland
- ◆ Chagim (Holidays): Learning about the Holidays of the Jewish Calendar from the original Rabbinical and Biblical sources and modern debates about the holidays and their meaning
- ◆ Machloket (Jewish Debate): Discussing modern and actual dilemmas from the Jewish sources and news media.
